ArtReach Alliance moves to new site in Stillwater

ArtReach Alliance, a Stillwater-based nonprofit arts organization, has moved into its new home.

The group purchased a historic house last summer at 224 N. Fourth St., across from the Stillwater Public Library.

This week, ArtReach's administrative offices moved from their previous home at the Washington County Historic Courthouse into the house at Fourth and Mulberry streets.

The home, built in 1858, has been updated for public use but isn't quite ready yet. A grand opening is slated for Oct. 24.

Once open, the ArtReach building will serve as a community arts center. It will house gallery space, studio space, classes, workshops and other events.

Volunteers are needed to help with the final touches, like painting, landscaping and cleaning.
